We are now in that part of the church calendar called "Ordinal Time". This is when the liturgical color is green and we are counting the Sundays between one holy day and the next, in this case Epiphany and Ash Wednesday.

During Ordinal Time the gospel lessons are about Jesus doing ministry: calling the disciples, preaching the Sermon on the Mount, Feeding the 5,000, healing the sick. As we hear these gospel stories read on Sundays, there are two questions to ask ourselves, "What is Jesus showing us about himself?" and "How can I emulate this?"

Neither you nor I have ever taken our sack lunch and miraculously multiplied it to feed thousands of people, nor have we touched someone and healed his/her cancer. We likely have not preached a completely new, radically life altering teaching to a crowd of thousands either. I don't believe Jesus calls most of us to that kind of emulation.

Jesus does call us to follow him and to embody God's mercy and love to everyone in our own settings. Join me in exploring Luke's gospel to discern Jesus' call to you.

Ruby's Pantry is held in Minnesota and Wisconsin every month. It is faith-based and is organized and hosted by a group of volunteers from a local church. The Ruby's Pantry distribution event is held either at the church location or at a site easily accessible for guests.

There are no income or resident limits/requirements and individuals can attend a Pantry at any city/state location. There is a \$20 donation per food share.

Ruby's Pantry Mission: To activate people in being alert to the needs of others and to be proactive in encouraging faith, showing friendship and meeting tangible needs of neighbors, friends and strangers regardless of race, religion or ethnicity.

There is a Ruby's Pantry located in Wisconsin Rapids at 501 17th Street South, on the third Saturday of each month and is hosted by Immanuel Lutheran Church.
